Working families desperately needed some relief this year, while facing the highest level of unemployment since the Great Depression.

Unfortunately, any progress for workers this year was overshadowed by the catastrophic cuts to education, health care, public safety, state workers and safety net programs. These cuts could have been avoided.

The refusal by the Governor and Republican leadership to consider popular revenue sources like a tobacco tax or oil severance fee created the roadmap to the disastrous budget negotiations. Long-term fiscal stability was ignored, and at every turn, the Governor sided with wealthy special interests at the expense of working families. When given the choice to support a tobacco tax or eliminate children’s health care, the Governor and some members of the Legislature sided with Big Tobacco. When given the choice to lay off thousands of teachers, firefighters and police or tax Big Oil, they sided with Big Oil. Time and again, they sided with wealthy corporations instead of working families.

This year, we again saw important principles bargained away in the budget. Budget bills are now routinely negotiated in the middle of the night with little time for even lawmakers to review. This year’s budget deals included a continuing appropriations bill with a provision stripping state workers of overtime and holiday pay. We cannot allow the budget process to be hijacked for worker takeaways.

While the Governor signed a handful of Labor bills this year, he took a number of actions that undermined collective bargaining rights. He submitted a budget that stripped state workers of collectively bargained holiday pay. He negotiated a memorandum of understanding with 95,000 SEIU Local 1000 state employees and then lobbied the Legislature against ratification. He furloughed all state employees, cutting wages by 15%, even in departments that are fully federally funded.

The Governor also stood in the way of good pro-worker legislation by vetoing bills that would have protected workers from indoor heat illness, prevented companies

from using credit checks as a barrier to employment, and kept employers from willfully misclassifying workers as independent contractors. Several labor-sponsored bills did not even make it to his desk, including bills that would have protected against the abuse of municipal bankruptcy to break union contracts, provided in-person assistance for the unemployed, and given students real opportunity through career technical education.

It’s never been clearer that our system needs reform. We need to eliminate the ludicrous two-thirds majority rule that allows a small minority to hold the state budget hostage to their narrow demands. We need to fix the state’s outdated tax system to ensure that the wealthy and corporations pay their fair share. We need new sources of revenue to ensure important programs in education, health care and other areas are adequately funded. And we need a path for an economic recovery that puts our members and all Californians back to work.

Finally, we need leaders with a real vision to bolster California’s middle class and the political backbone to get the job done. California’s working families won’t soon forget this year’s debacle and the unnecessary pain it’s caused. We commit anew to electing real leaders in California who will put families first and holding legislators on both sides of the aisle accountable for the actions they take.

Key Labor Bills

Assembly Bills

1. SEIU STATE EMPLOYEES MOU. AB 88 (Committee on Public Employees, Retirement, and Social Security)

This bill ratified the Memorandum of Understanding negotiated between the Schwarzenegger Administration and SEIU Local 1000. It contains compromises and concessions by both labor and management, saves the State \$340 million, and was ratified by 95 percent of the 95,000 employees it covers.

SUPPORT

SENATE: Failed on Senate floor on 9/12/09

2. PROTECTION FROM MUNICIPAL BANKRUPTCY. AB 155 (Mendoza)

This bill would have protected workers’ collective bargaining rights by creating a state oversight process to prevent cities and counties from using municipal bankruptcy to break union contracts.

SUPPORT

ASSEMBLY: 47-25 on 6/3/09

SENATE: Held in Senate Local Government Committee

3. CARWASH WORKER LABOR LAW ENFORCEMENT. AB 236 (Swanson)

Carwash workers are among the most exploited workers in California. This bill maintains the Carwash Registry Act, requiring carwashes to register with the state, which allows state investigators to target scofflaw carwash employers and gives workers a chance to organize for better conditions.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 51-27 on 6/2/09

SENATE: 25-15 on 9/3/09

4. BAN ON PREDATORY MORTGAGE LENDING. AB 260 (Lieu)

This bill will protect borrowers from being steered into high-cost, high-risk loans they do not understand and cannot afford by banning some of the most abusive lending practices that created the foreclosure free-fall.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 50-28 on 6/1/09

SENATE: 22-18 on 9/8/09

5. PAYDAY LENDING EXPANSION. AB 377 (Mendoza)

This bill would have almost doubled the payday loan limit from \$300 to \$500, without capping the interest rate charged. These rates can go as high as 459%.

OPPOSED UNLESS AMENDED

ASSEMBLY: 53-8 on 5/11/09

SENATE: Held in Senate Judiciary Committee

6. WORKERS' COMPENSATION DATABASE.

AB 483 (Buchanan)

This bill will create a publicly searchable database of employers and their workers’ compensation insurance company. Such information will protect injured workers, discourage workers’ compensation fraud and crack down on the underground economy.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 78-0 on 5/21/09

SENATE: 33-7 on 9/8/09

7. DIRECT EMPLOYMENT OF DOCTORS.

AB 646 (Swanson)

This bill would have helped alleviate a chronic shortage of physicians in rural and underserved communities by allowing the direct employment of physicians and surgeons.

SUPPORT

ASSEMBLY: 57-15 on 5/28/09

SENATE: Held in Senate Business, Professions, and Economic Development Committee

8. INDOOR HEAT ILLNESS PROTECTION.

AB 838 (Swanson)

This legislation would have protected workers in hot indoor worksites from heat illness by requiring the Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) to create an indoor heat standard.

SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 49-30 on 6/2/09

SENATE: 24-15 on 9/4/09

9. IMPROVED UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE.

AB 857 (Galgiani)

With unemployment rates at their highest levels in more than two decades, this bill would have improved access to unemployment insurance (UI) assistance by using existing funds to place trained UI eligibility workers in the state’s one-stop career centers.

SUPPORT

ASSEMBLY: 60-14 on 6/2/09

SENATE: Held in Senate Appropriations Committee

10. BAN ON CREDIT CHECKS IN EMPLOYMENT.

AB 943 (Mendoza)

Forty percent of employers now use credit checks to screen job applicants. This bill would have banned the use of credit checks for employment purposes unless it is substantially job related.

SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 49-30 on 5/28/09

SENATE: 24-14 on 9/3/09

Key Labor Bills

11. HOSPITAL SAFETY AND SECURITY.

AB 1083. (J. A. Pérez)

This bill will protect workers and patients by requiring that hospitals annually review and update their safety and security assessment plans.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 76-0 on 5/28/09

SENATE: 35-0 on 8/17/09

12. LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL FOR TRADE AGREEMENTS. AB 1276 (Skinner)

This bill would have prevented the Governor from binding California to international trade agreements without legislative approval.

SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 50-29 on 5/28/09

SENATE: 23-13 on 9/9/09

13. BAN ON REQUIRING FLAWED IMMIGRATION VERIFICATION. AB 1288 (Fong)

The E-Verify Program allows employers to access the Social Security Administration's database to verify a worker's immigration status. This database was never intended for this use and is full of inaccuracies that harm workers and employers. This bill would have prohibited cities or counties from requiring employers to use E-Verify.

SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 55-22 on 5/28/09

SENATE: 25-13 on 8/24/09

14. Cal/OSHA PENALTY REPORT. AB 1561 (Assembly Committee on Labor and Employment)

The Cal/OSHA Appeals Board has made it a practice to negotiate away penalties, drop citations based on technicalities, and allow serious health and safety hazards to remain while employers appeal them. This bill would have required the Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) to collaborate with the Cal/OSHA Appeals Board and produce an outcome study of health and safety citations and penalties.

SUPPORT / VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 49-30 on 6/1/09

SENATE: 25-13 on 9/1/09

15. UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE BENEFITS EXTENSION. ABx3 23 (Coto)

This bill allows the state's long-term laid off workers to collect an additional 20 weeks of unemployment benefits, fully funded by the federal government. It also allows California to collect over \$839 million from the federal government for the state's bankrupt unemployment insurance trust fund and more than \$5 billion in federal aid to help bolster the state's battered unemployment insurance system.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 77-0 on 3/23/09

SENATE: 38-0 on 3/26/09

16. UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ELIGIBILITY. ABx3 29 (Coto)

Because of the outdated methods California used to calculate UI eligibility, only 35% of the state's unemployed workers are collecting benefits. This bill expands access to unemployment insurance benefits by adopting an Alternative Base Period, allowing for a worker's most recent earnings to be used to calculate UI benefits. Seasonal and temporary workers will benefit from this change.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 60-6 on 3/26/09

SENATE: 31-7 on 3/26/09

17. PRIVATIZATION OF ELIGIBILITY JOBS. ABx4 7 (Evans)

This bill allows the Governor to privatize and contract out up to 30,000 eligibility worker jobs and forces poor families to apply online for lifeline benefits, like food stamps and Medi-Cal.

OPPOSE / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 46-30 on 7/24/09

SENATE: 25-15 on 7/23/09

Key Labor Bills

Senate Bills

18. INCREASE TEMPORARY NURSING FACULTY. SB 182 (Ashburn)

This bill would have exacerbated the trend toward contingent work in community colleges by allowing temporary nursing faculty to teach an unlimited number of semesters and permanently excluding nursing faculty from the existing 75% – 25% full-time to part-time faculty ratio.

OPPOSE

ASSEMBLY: Held In Assembly Higher Education Committee

SENATE: 26-5 on 5/18/09

19. INJURED WORKERS' RIGHT TO SEE THEIR OWN DOCTOR. SB 186 (DeSaulnier)

Our right to see our own doctors if we get injured on the job was set to expire on December 31, 2009 unless this bill was signed. This legislation deleted that sunset date allowing workers to continue to see their own doctors if they are injured on the job.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 69-2 on 9/3/09

SENATE: 29-10 on 4/27/09

20. EXPANSION OF CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE). SB 381 (Wright)

This bill would have preserved student access to both college preparatory courses and academically rigorous Career Technical Education (CTE) in today's high schools by requiring that at least three career technical education courses were included in the optional graduation requirements.

SUPPORT

ASSEMBLY: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee

SENATE: 32-2 on 5/21/09

21. CREATING UNION JOBS. SB 792 (Leno)

This legislation authorizes a transfer of public trust lands from the State of California to the City of San Francisco to facilitate the transformation of the Hunters Point Naval Shipyard into a thriving neighborhood with new homes, parks and jobs for local residents. This project will create 10,000 jobs, provide \$83 million in community benefits, create over 3,000 affordable housing units, and establish over 300 acres of parks.

SUPPORT / SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 69-1 on 9/9/09

SENATE: 24-15 on 9/3/09

Committee Votes

22. BENEFITS STUDY FOR PART-TIME TEACHERS. AB 360 (Ma)

This bill would have required the California State Teachers Retirement System (CalSTRS) to study whether the current benefit structure meets the needs of part-time teachers and how to improve it.

SUPPORT

ASSEMBLY: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee.

23. PAID SICK DAYS. AB 1000 (Ma)

Over 40% of the state's workforce, 6 million workers, have no paid sick days. This bill would have allowed all workers to earn one hour of sick time for every thirty hours worked.

SUPPORT

ASSEMBLY: Held in Assembly Appropriations Committee

24. RATE REGULATION FOR HEALTH INSURANCE COMPANIES. AB 1218 (Jones)

This bill would have controlled healthcare costs by establishing state oversight over insurance company premium increases.

SUPPORT

ASSEMBLY: Held in Assembly Health Committee

25. SINGLE PAYER HEALTHCARE. SB 810 (Leno)

This bill would have established the California Healthcare System to cover every Californian with comprehensive health care and give them the ability to choose their own physician.

SUPPORT

SENATE: Held in Senate Appropriations Committee

26. PENALIZING PUBLIC SCHOOLS, TEACHERS, AND SCHOOL EMPLOYEES. SBx5 1 (Romero)

This bill would have imposed punitive accountability measures and sanctions on public schools without any accountability for charter schools. It would also force low-performing schools to close, privatize or do mass layoffs of staff. This bill was intended to make California competitive for federal grant funds, but went beyond what federal regulations required in penalizing public school teachers and school employees and favoring charter schools.

OPPOSE

ASSEMBLY: Held in Assembly Education Committee.
