In 2013, Labor won big legislative victories for workers:
Ending the anti-worker Enterprise Zone program and
repurposing it for good job creation, a minimum wage
increased to the highest in the nation, the strongest
protections ever for immigrant workers facing retaliation,
and new incentives for cities to pay prevailing wage.

These victories were won by union members who filled the Capitol halls in record numbers this year. They were won by immigrant workers who bravely told their stories in legislative hearings as their bosses looked on. We won because workers stood together and stood up for dignity, respect, and fairness.

As we celebrate these achievements, we will not lose sight of the realities most workers face every day. Too many workers work multiple part-time jobs just to make ends meet or labor for years as “temporary” workers. Wealth inequality undermines our progress and threatens our economic recovery.

At a time when elected democrats are becoming more timid, we must be bold in our fight to rebuild the middle class. When immigrant workers at the Marquez Brothers plant in Hanford faced threats and firings for trying to organize for better conditions, Assembly Labor Chair Roger Hernandez led fellow legislators all the way to Hanford to stand with those workers.

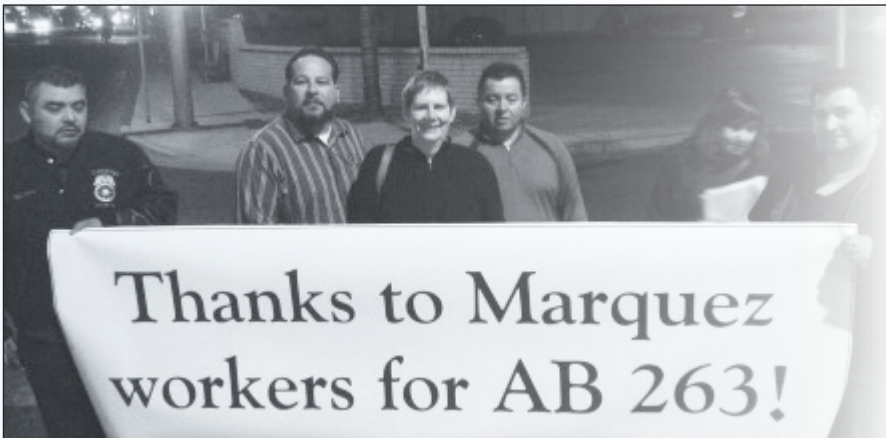
Now is the time for true leadership to stand up for working people, tackle income inequality and build a stable middle class for everyone.

Labor Supported Bills

Assembly

1. **The Trust Act. AB 4 (Ammiano).** Provides safeguards against the federal Secure Communities Act (S-Comm) by limiting the detention of immigrants by local law enforcement.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 44-22 (5/16/13) SENATE: 25-11 (9/9/13)

2. **Minimum Wage. AB 10 (Alejo).** Governor Brown and the legislative leadership negotiated a 25% increase in the state’s minimum wage, bringing CA to the highest in the country.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 45-27 (5/30/13) SENATE: 26-11 (9/12/13)

3. **Enterprise Zone reform. AB 93 (Asm. Budget Committee).** Repurposed the broken Enterprise Zone program to more effectively create good new jobs, with strong labor protections, in areas of the state with the highest levels of unemployment and poverty.

2/3RDS VOTE REQUIRED.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 54-16 (6/27/13) SENATE: 30-9 (6/25/13)

4. **“Ban the box” bill for hiring. AB 218 (Dickinson).** Prohibits state and local government employers from screening job applicants for criminal conviction history until the agency determines potential hires’ minimum qualifications.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 48-29 (5/30/13) SENATE: 21-16 (9/12/13)

5. **Domestic Workers’ Bill of Rights. AB 241 (Ammiano).** This historic bill grants daily and weekly overtime pay to domestic workers excluded from federal and state law.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 45-25 (5/29/13) SENATE: 23-12 (9/11/13)

6. **Stop immigration-related retaliation. AB 263 (Hernández).** Prohibits employers from demanding new immigration documents, implementing e-verify, or threatening to call immigration authorities after workers have exercised protected labor rights or face suspension of a business license.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 52-23 (5/29/13) SENATE: 27-11 (9/9/13)

7. **Definition of extortion. AB 524 (Mullin).** Makes it a crime to use immigration threats to get away with wage theft by adding those threats to the definition of extortion.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 55-18 (5/29/13) SENATE: 29-8 (9/9/13)

8. **Public employee bargaining. AB 537 (Bonta).** Makes changes to the Meyers-Milias-Brown Act (MMBA) to strengthen bargaining and arbitration procedures for local agencies and employee unions.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 54-24 (5/30/13) SENATE: 26-11 (9/11/13)

9. **Local economic incentives. AB 562 (Williams).** Requires local agencies to disclose to the public the economic incentives they provide, and to review, hold hearings, and report on the subsidies.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 49-19 (5/23/13) SENATE: 23-11 (8/26/13)

10. **Court contracting out. AB 566 (Wieckowski).** Would have required performance standards to be met before trial court services can be contracted out by the state.

VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 51-25 (5/30/13) SENATE: 22-12 (9/12/13)

11. **Family child care providers. AB 641 (Rendon).** Would allow family child care providers, who are small business owners, the right to join together to collectively address matters that affect their business, such as quality, training, rate setting, collective purchasing and health care.

PASSED ASSEMBLY FLOOR 51-25-3 (5/30/13)

NOT TAKEN UP IN SENATE

12. **Supercenter economic analysis. AB 667 (Hernández).** Would have required a local agency to consider an independent economic analysis before approving a supercenter.

ASSEMBLY: 41-31 (5/28/13)

FAILED IN SENATE LOCAL GOVT 3-2 (6/26/13)

13. Union privilege. AB 729 (Hernández). Would have made specified communications between union members and their representatives privileged and protected.

VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 48-27 (5/28/13) SENATE: 23-10 (9/3/13)

14. Pension analysis. AB 822 (Hall). Would have required local measures affecting employee pension plans to be on the General Election ballot and contain an actuarial analysis of the measure in the voter handbook.

VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 52-19 (5/23/13) SENATE: 27-11 (9/9/13)

15. Volunteer signature requirement. AB 857 (Fong). Would have required that 10% of all signatures submitted to qualify statewide ballot measures be gathered by grassroots circulators.

VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 53-24 (5/29/13) SENATE: 23-11 (9/10/13)

16. Close the Wal-Mart Loophole. AB 880 (Gomez). Would impose a penalty on large employers who dump workers onto the state Medi-Cal program by cutting hours and eliminating benefits in response to the Affordable Care Act.
2/3RDS VOTE REQUIRED.

PASSED ASSEMBLY HEALTH CMTE. 13-5 (4/30/13)

FAILED ON THE ASSEMBLY FLOOR 46-27

17. Hospital charity care. AB 975 (Wieckowski). Would hold hospitals accountable for providing charity care.

FAILED ON THE ASSEMBLY FLOOR 28-38 (5/30/13)

18. Prevailing wage update. AB 1140 (Daly). Would have ensured the most recent prevailing wage determination applies on its effective date for all projects regardless of the bid date.

VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 54-24 (5/30/13) SENATE: 26-13 (8/26/13)

19. Wage liens. AB 1164 (Lowenthal). Would have allowed workers to put wage liens on the property where work was performed to secure unpaid wages.

PASSED ASSEMBLY JUDICIARY 6-3 (4/23/13)

PASSED ASSEMBLY LABOR 4-2 (5/1/13)

NOT TAKEN UP IN ASSEMBLY APPROPRIATIONS

20. Serious hazard abatement. AB 1165 (Skinner). Would have protected the health and safety of workers by requiring employers to fix serious violations while appeals are pending.

VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 47-19 (5/16/13) SENATE: 23-13 (9/11/13)

21. Improve prevailing wage enforcement. AB 1336 (Frazier). Improves prevailing wage enforcement. Assists the Labor Agency to combat the underground economy and the failure to pay prevailing wage.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 49-21 (5/24/13) SENATE: 25-11 (9/3/13)

22. Firefighter death benefits. AB 1373 (J. Pérez). Extends the statute of limitations for dependents of public safety officers to file a workers' compensation claim for death benefits.

VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 60-12 (5/2/13) SENATE: 36-0 (9/9/13)

23. Protect car wash registry. AB 1387 (Hernández). Removes the sunset on the car wash registry, making it a permanent program, and increases the surety bond requirement for car wash operators.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 54-23 (5/29/13) SENATE: 24-13 (9/6/13)

Senate

24. Protect prevailing wage law. SB 7 (Steinberg/Cannella). Disqualifies cities that ban the prevailing wage from receiving state construction grants.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 52-22 (9/4/13) SENATE: 28-10 (5/28/13)

25. Farm worker contract mediation. SB 25 (Steinberg). Would have provided for contract mediation in the agricultural industry for second and third contracts if parties have failed to reach agreement.

PASSED SENATE FLOOR 23-10 (5/6/13)

PASSED ASSEMBLY FLOOR 43-25 (8/19/13)

26. Charter city elections. SB 311 (Padilla). Requires charter proposals to be placed on general election ballots to maximize voter participation.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 45-27 (8/8/13) SENATE: 25-9 (5/6/13)

27. Enterprise Zone reform. SB 434 (Hill). Would have required new wage and worker protection standards be met for Enterprise Zone tax credits.

PASSED SENATE GO FI 5-2 (5/1/13)

PASSED SENATE APPROPRIATIONS 4-2 (5/20/13)

NOT TAKEN UP IN SENATE

28. Contractor uniform requirements. SB 556 (Corbett). Would hold companies and public agencies liable for any harm to workers or consumers arising from contracts where the contractor wore the uniform of the contracting agency or city.

SENATE: 24-13 (5/30/13)

NOT TAKEN UP IN ASSEMBLY

29. Classified professional development. SB 590 (de León). Requires local education agencies to set aside a portion of state or federal funds for professional development for classified employees.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 51-24 (9/4/13) SENATE: 28-9 (5/29/13)

30. Strengthen retaliation law. SB 666 (Steinberg). Creates new penalties for employers and lawyers who engage in immigration-related threats and expands whistleblower protection for all workers.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 52-17 (9/9/13) SENATE: 31-7 (5/28/13)

31. Expand family leave. SB 770 (Jackson). Expands the scope of the state disability program to include time off to care for a seriously ill grandparent, grandchild, sibling or parent-in-law.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 51-22 (9/4/13) SENATE: 29-10 (5/28/13)

32. Labor compliance. SB 776 (Corbett). Prevents entities from taking credit against the prevailing wage to fund phony labor compliance programs.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 52-23 (8/8/13) SENATE: 24-10 (5/9/13)

Labor Opposed Bills

33. Workers' compensation takeaway from athletes. AB 1309 (Perea). Limits access to the California workers' compensation system for professional athletes employed by out-of-state teams.

SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 61-4 (5/2/13) SENATE: 34-2 (9/6/13)

34. 8-hour day takeaway. SB 607 (Berryhill). Would have allowed employers to cut individual deals with workers to waive daily overtime.

FAILED PASSAGE IN SENATE LABOR 1-3 (4/24/13)
